Students who meet the eligibility requirements below can receive the maximum amount of the Federal Pell Grant, regardless of the calculated Student Aid Index (SAI). Other aid will be awarded based on the calculated SAI. Documentation must be submitted to verify eligibility. Award eligibility will be limited if this documentation is submitted after the semester is over.

Who should submit this form:

- The child of a parent or guardian died in the line of duty while (a) serving on active duty as a member of the Armed Forces on or after September 11, 2001; OR (b) actively serving as and performing the duties of a public safety officer; AND
- To qualify in the 2025-26 award year, a student must be less than 33 years old as of January 1, 2025, to be eligible.

Definitions

A public safety officer generally includes the following:

- Law enforcement officer, firefighter, or chaplain
- Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) employee
- Emergency management or civil defense agency employee
- Member of a rescue squad or ambulance crew
- Others defined in the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968.

SUBMIT REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION

1. **A valid 2025-26 FAFSA, submitted with our school code - 002329.**
2. **ATTACH ALL supporting documentation:**
 - A death certificate, **AND**
 - Written confirmation of active-duty status at the time of death from the military command or public safety entity.
